NOTES FOR AUTHORS

- 1. The *New Zealand Law Review* is published quarterly by the Legal Research Foundation, and is widely regarded as New Zealand's leading law review.
- 2. The *Review* includes articles, and regular reviews of major areas of law written by specialist contributing editors.
- 3. The *Review* welcomes the submission of articles. The *Review* is a refereed journal. Submissions will be assessed by experts in the relevant field; the Editors' usual practice is to obtain two such reviews. Peer review is on an anonymous basis. The Editors' decisions as to acceptance are final.
- 4. The Editors will not consider articles that have been published elsewhere or are concurrently under consideration for publication elsewhere. Authors should confirm this is not the case when making submissions.
- 5. Please submit articles by email to the editors, as an email attachment in Word format. Articles should
 - include an abstract of approximately 150 words, and a short statement of the author's current affiliations and any other relevant personal details;
 - comply with the *New Zealand Law Style Guide (Third Edition*), available online at http://www.lawfoundation.org.nz/style-guide/; and
 - be 8,000 13,000 words in length (including all footnotes).
- 6. Authors whose articles are accepted for publication
 - receive a copy of the relevant journal part and a PDF offprint (which is not to be posted online);
 - agree to assign to the publisher their rights to payments distributed by reproduction rights organizations in relation to the *Review*; and
 - agree to license the publisher to publish articles appearing in the *Review* through online databases operated by third parties such as Lexis.com and HeinOnline, and to offer articles for sale online (as well as in print) individually or as an online subscription.
